Whether storyboarding, instructional design, voiceovers, animations, and interactivity are expected deliverables?	- Storyboarding and instructional design form part of the consultant's scope and will be undertaken to transform the provided content into engaging, learner-centred e-learning modules. Voiceovers, animations, and interactivity are expected deliverables to the extent necessary to support effective learning and in line with the approved instructional design, curriculum requirements, and donor guidelines. The level of complexity for these elements will be agreed upon during the design and approval phase.
